If you are selecting a degree or a course, my advice is to not confuse your first love with your career prospects. Determine your area of interest and play to your strengths. If you are patient and fortunate enough to have both develop into passions, that is fantastic.

Keep in mind that you are not giving up your first love. You can also devote time to activities that you love, regardless of whether you studied them at university.
