

## MACC remands professor for alleged abuse of power

Selangor Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) has remanded a deputy director of a local university for allegedly abusing his position to demand over RM30,000 in profits from an international conference programme organised by the institution.

A five-day remand application was granted by Magistrate Nur Faizah Abdul Sani starting from today until March 6.

The remand application was applied at the Magistrate Court 3, Shah Alam Selangor.

Sources said, the male suspect who is in his 40s, is also a Jusa C grade professor.

He was arrested at about 3.30pm yesterday <u>MACC nabs professor for alleged abuse</u> of power after he came to the Selangor MACC office to give his statement. Sources said the suspect decided on his own to deposit the proceeds into his personal bank account in August 2021.

Selangor MACC Director, Datuk Alias Salim confirmed the arrest, adding that the case was investigated under Section 23 of the MACC Act 2009.
